Social Climate - Parent, teacher and student satisfaction with the school

The College views its relationship with parents as a partnership in their child's education, therefore parents are encouraged to be involved in their child's education at the level that suits them best. This may be as classroom helpers in literacy and numeracy programs, arts coordinators, camp helpers, sports coaches, guest lecturers or coming along to the classroom to assist or view students' presentations.

Our volunteer program 'Freshwater Friends' continues to grow and Parents are welcome to volunteer in specific areas within the College, including the Library, Café and Horticulture Program.

Our Parent Class Ambassador program continues to go from strength to strength. The Parent Class Ambassador is a volunteer who, under the guidance of our Marketing Communications Officer, provides other parents in their child's class with support, friendship, and care.

The College values all stakeholders, and in order to protect our community from the COVID-19 pandemic, a number of our community engagement activities were moved online or cancelled. We continued to engage with our parents throughout the online learning phase and beyond, with staff making contact at least weekly to provide support for families.

One online parent forum conducted in Term 3 2020 received 82 responses. The following is an extract:

This is a summary of the post-school destinations of students from Freshwater Christian College who completed Year 12 and gained a Senior Statement in 2020. The results are from the *Year 12 Completers Survey*, which is conducted approximately six months after students completed Year 12.

73.3% response rate

22 out of 30 Year 12 completers from this school responded to the 2021 survey.
Results may not be representative of all Year 12 completers at this school.

Post-school destinations



In 2021, 95.5% of Year 12 completers from Freshwater Christian College were engaged in education, training or employment in the year after they completed school.



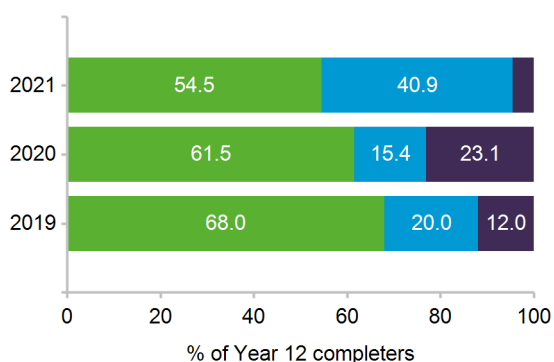
Of the 22 respondents, 54.5% continued in some recognised form of education and training. The most common study destination was bachelor degree.



A further 40.9% transitioned directly into paid employment and no further study.

All Year 12 completers were assigned to a *main destination*. Respondents who were both studying and working are reported as being in education or training, including apprentices and trainees.
